
# How to Create a ChatGPT-Proof Assignment



## Part 1: How are students prompting ChatGPT?

Not all ChatGPT prompts will yield high quality responses. Before attempting to make a "ChatGPT-Proof" Assignment, first understand how your students are prompting ChatGPT.

Here's an example of 3 students prompting ChatGPT to write a paper. The prompts increase in specificity from student 1 to 3. Thus, student 3's output from ChatGPT will be much stronger.

**Student 1:** Write a 1,000 word essay on the movie "Idiocracy"

**Student 2:** I need help writing an essay on the movie Idiocracy. What are 5 thesis statements I could write about regarding the movie Idiocracy? [New Message] Write a 1000-word essay on the movie Idiocracy. Specifically, include the thesis statement "The character of Joe Bauers in Idiocracy symbolizes the transformative power of individual agency and the potential for positive change, inspiring viewers to challenge societal norms and embrace intellectual curiosity."

**Student 3:** I believe Idiocracy and Wall-E are incredibly similar films, with similar themes and endings. Can you compare and contrast the films Idiocracy and Wall-E in 1,000 words? [New Message] Can you rewrite the above, but focus on the similarities between Joe and Wall-E, as it relates to their "reluctant hero" journey? Be sure to include references to specific scenes.

- Message 1: Can you help me come up with a topic idea for this
  assignment, "You will write a [abc]." I would like it to include [xyz].
- Message 2: Can you create an outline for a paper, "[title of paper that was generated by GPT in prompt 1]"
- Message 3: Can you help me find sources for the paper, "[title of paper that was generated by GPT in prompt 1]"
- Message 4: Using the outline and sources above, can you write a fiveparagraph essay on the topic, "[title of paper that was generated by GPT in prompt 1]"

Here's an example of how your students may be prompting ChatGPT to write their papers.

This is a popularly used guide amongst students (source)

ChatGPT really wants to follow the rules you make. Leverage that, but also, beware!

If you tell it to find or do something, it's going to follow that command, even if it has to be factually inaccurate or a bit contradictory to do so.

This is where humans - including students - may slip up!

## Run your own experiment!

- 1. Input one of your writing prompts in ChatGPT
- 2. Use the guide above or experiment until you get the best output you think you can get
- 3. Once you're satisfied with a ChatGPT output, score the output against your rubric
- 4. Once you're done scoring, complete a short reflection:
  - a. What score did GPT achieve?
  - b. What did GPT do well in regards to your prompt?
  - c. What didn't GPT do well in regards to your prompt?

# Part 2: The Key to a ChatGPT-Proof Assignment? Authenticity.

What is an authentic assessment? Well, according to the educators at Packback, an authentic assessment...

Is focused on the application of course material to real world contexts

Is aligned to course objectives and will lead to skill development

Gives students a sense of autonomy or choice

Is clear and structured

*Is fun to complete as a student* 

*Is fun to grade as an instructor* 

Our Bench of former educators over at Packback created an "Authentic Assessment Checklist." Those first 4 (bolded) checkpoints are really your must-haves when building authentic assignments as they are foundational to students' abilities to start and complete the work.

We find that a high quality, authentic assessment usually checks *at least 5-6 boxes*. Use the Authentic Assessment Checklist below.

Does your assignment meet the four "non-negotiables?" Does your assignment check at least 5-6 boxes?

Authentic Assessment Checklist
☐ Has a purpose that aligns to at least one course objective and/or department/program objective
Helps students develop or strengthen skills they can apply elsewhere
Graded in reference to legitimate performance standards or benchmarks (not on a curve)
☐ Involves transparent, de-mystified expectations
Requires students to document the process of completing the assignment
Makes self-assessment or self-reflection part of the assessment
Requires students to conduct their own research
Requires students to gather their own data
☐ Involves experts/audience members from outside the classroom
Requires students to solve an open-ended problem, perhaps as though they are professionals in the field
of discipline
Replicates or simulates the contexts in which professionals are "tested" in the workplace or personal life
Requires students to create a new solution, product, or service
Students are given autonomy or choice in what they write about
Asks students to speak to personal experiences, preferences, or interests

## Part 3: Modify your Writing Prompt to be "More Authentic"... with ChatGPT

This next section will give you a prompt to feed to ChatGPT in order to help re-write your writing prompt. But first, you'll need to reflect on the previous experiment & checklist and answer these three questions:

- 1. What is something ChatGPT didn't do well when answering your prompt (meeting a requirement or a quality of writing)?
- 2. What are 1-2 requirements from the Authentic Assessment checklist that you would like to add to your assignment?
- 3. Where is there overlap between something GPT didn't do well *and* something you'd like to add from the checklist?

We're going to have you use a pre-written prompt in ChatGPT. But before using the prompt, we want to give you insight into *how the prompt was engineered:* 

A highly repeatable, high quality prompt template for ChatGPT

- 1. Define ChatGPT's Role "Act as"
- 2. Provide Context
- 3. State the Task or Question
- 4. Set Constraints or Limitations
- 5. Offer Additional Guidance

## Feed this to ChatGPT to Modify your Writing Prompt

Act as a curriculum designer with a focus on authentic assessment. The purpose of authentic assessment is to not only assesses students' learning, but to also teach students and improve their skills and understanding of course content. An authentic assignment is one that requires the application of what students have learned to a new situation, and that demands judgment to determine what information and skills are relevant and how they should be used.

You are an expert at improving writing assignments to discourage students from abusing Al and encouraging critical thinking. Your job is to evaluate instructors' writing assignments based on the authentic assessment checklist and provide recommendations on how the writing assignment can be improved.

The following is the authentic assessment checklist:

- Has a purpose that aligns to at least one course objective and/or department/program objective
- Helps students develop or strengthen skills they can apply elsewhere
- Graded in reference to legitimate performance standards or benchmarks (not on a curve)
- Involves transparent, de-mystified expectations
- Requires students to document the process of completing the assignment

Evaluate my writing assessment below using the above checklist. Be sure to specify in simple terms what requirements are met, and which are missing, and then prioritize which three requirements should be added to the assignment and explain why those three. All requirements on the checklist should be addressed. Provide examples of how these requirements could be met.

Your response should be organized in the following format: 1: List which requirements are met and explain why. 2: List which requirements are missing. 3: Detail your recommendation for the three requirements to be added and provide examples. 4: Explain why those three requirements are the most important to add in order to make the assignment more meaningful and valuable to students. Use bullet points for clarity.

## Part 4: Making ChatGPT your Educator Superpower

**Brainstorming learning activities:** Generate creative ideas for lesson plans, activities, and projects that align with your curriculum goals.

Your response should be organized in the following format: 1: List what the lesson does well and why. 2: List what can be improved and how. 3: Detail your recommendation for three instructional strategies that could be most impactful to add and provide examples. 4: Explain why those three instructional strategies are the most important to add in order to make the assignment more accessible and valuable to students. Use bullet points for clarity.
